

Ffion's Cinnamon Biscuits

For all you people that don't know me, my name is Ffion Gallantree and I have a little business called '*Cake Tastic*' which is homemade cakes and biscuits made to order.

One of the greatest recipes that I have prepared would have to be cinnamon biscuits.

To make these biscuits you will need:

350g (12oz) plain flour
1 heaped tsp cinnamon
1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
100g (4oz) butter
175g (6oz) soft light brown sugar
1 egg
4 tbsp golden syrup

1. Turn on oven at gas mark 5.
2. Sift the flour, cinnamon and bicarbonate soda in a large bowl.
3. Cut butter into chunks and add to the bowl, cover the butter with the flour.
4. Rub the butter into the flour until like breadcrumbs, stir the sugar in.
5. Put the egg and golden syrup in a small bowl and mix together then add to mixture.
6. Form a dough and put on a floured surface.
7. Play softly with the dough until smooth.
8. Roll the dough until a 5mm thickness, cut out with cutters.
9. Put the biscuits onto a greased tray and put them in the oven for 12-15 minutes.
10. Take the biscuits out. Cool and eat!

PC continues search for fifth body – are you bothered?


