

HISTORY CHURCH

Chancel

20'4" 12'3"

Chancel Arch 4 centred, of two orders, plain chamfered, dying into wall. North and South Windows. 2-light, perpendicular. Piscina modern – restored. Screenwork late, restored.

Nave

35'2" 18'4"

Against North wall, opposite South Porch; a plain niche. West Arch well moulded, of four orders, from corbels.

North Transept

16'9" by 13'

A medallion Monument by Bacon. Britannia weeping, with flags reversed.

South Transept

18' by 13'

Tower

West Tower, 15' by 13'8", of 2 stages, without Buttress. Parapet embattled, coping discontinuous.

Font

8r. perpendicular, under open West Arch.

Vestry

South Porch used as Vestry. The inner door of perpendicular Screen work.

The Chancel of this Church has been refitted by the present Incumbent, and much done to other parts of the building – in style, perhaps, somewhat at variance with ancient example. The Piscina is used as a Credence. The Chancel is panelled, in dark oak; a good oak table and finger organ have been recently supplied to him. A silver chalice and cover, 1576.
