SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES RELAUNCH - BECAUSE CHILDHOOD CAN'T WAIT

I am delighted to let you know that Home-Start Exeter and East Devon has obtained a grant to relaunch in Honiton and the surrounding villages. I have been involved as a volunteer with the charity for some years following a Buckerell village email request for trustees living in East Devon and became Chair of The Board in 2015.

The charity matches volunteers with families who are struggling to provide support, expert help and friendship on a regular basis in their own home. There's a huge list of things that people struggle with – like having twins, being in an area they don't know, family breakdowns, mental health, lack of transport to get to mother and baby groups, in fact anything that disrupts the normal functioning of a family.

Our trained volunteers go in and support the family one day a week for a couple of hours and work alongside them. We don't go in and tell a family what they need to be doing, we chat with them and discuss what areas they're struggling with and provide them with a volunteer who might be able to help.

We are currently looking for people to volunteer around Honiton and are running a volunteer training course at Awliscombe Village Hall on Tuesdays 9.30a.m. to 2.30p.m. For further information please call me on 07850 056563 or the office on 01392 826299 or email office@homestartexeter.co.uk
