## **Local Government Reorganisation**

Devon is undergoing a major transformation in how local government works.

The number of Devon councils is due to be reduced as part of UK Government proposals to create 'empowered, simplified, resilient and sustainable' unitary authorities. This means that the current district and county council model will be replaced by a unitary council, responsible for delivering all services within a particular area; a new Devon.

Growing Futures: Homes for children and young people in care in Devon

In a decisive shift from previous policy, the Council will move away from largely commissioning residential care and instead invest £156 million into directly delivering services, including the creation of 12 new children's homes, 20 specialist foster placements, and up to four new therapeutic schools across the county.
